His work has resulted in one book, 24 chapters, and around 90 journal publications.

He is an active collaborator with WHO and has served as a Trustee of the International Center for Diarrheal Disease Research, Bangladesh (ICDDR,B). He is a member of the Child Health Epidemiology Reference Group (CHERG) and the Foodborne Epidemiology Reference Group (FERG) of WHO. He is also founder of the Child Health and Nutrition Research Initiative Foundation (CHNRI) in Switzerland.

He is an Associate member of Department of International Health at Johns Hopkins School of Public Health (JHSPH) and Honorary Professor at the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine (LSHTM). He was also founder and professor of the School of Medicine at the Peruvian University of Applied Sciences.
